Why is Family Promise needed in Houston County?

- The latest Houston County Board of Education report identified over 300 homeless students. We know from national averages the homeless children population is 50-100% higher due to under reporting, and this number does not include pre-school age children. Thus, we estimate there are 600 homeless children in our county.
- There has been an 18.8% increase in homeless children in Georgia school systems over the past seven years.
- ◆ It is estimated that 60% of the homeless family population are children; 50% of these children are under the age of six.
- Of the shelter beds for the homeless in Houston County, none provide for intact families, or mothers with sons over the age of 12 or single fathers with daughters.
- Nationwide, 80% of families who participate in Family Promise programs find permanent housing; in our program 85% have moved into permanent housing.
- Parents entering our program are either unemployed or underemployed. By completion of our program, 90% have a sustainable income.

Since opening our doors 170 children now have a home.
